


A Word From Tony

Pentecost

The historical and Biblical origins of what we know as Pentecost can be found in Exodus 23:14-19, Leviticus 23:15-16 and Deuteronomy 16:10. One of three significant Jewish festivals, Pentecost comes from the Greek word Pentekostos which the fiftieth day of, is the also known as the Festival of Weeks. This was a prominent feast in the Jewish calendar that celebrated God giving them the 10 Commandments 50 days after the Exodus from Egypt. God instructed His people to celebrate the Festival of Weeks, which was to be held 7 full weeks (49 days) plus one day after Passover, equalling 50 days. Also called the Feast of Harvest, this was when the Jews would present offerings of the first fruits of their spring crops. Jewish law required all adult Jewish men to come to Jerusalem from wherever they were living to personally be in attendance for the celebration.

In Acts chapters 1-2, we learn that about 120 followers of Jesus were gathered in prayer in an upper room of Jerusalem, having recently seen Jesus ascend and return to His Father in heaven. While the believers were gathered, the Holy Spirit came upon them with flames of fire and violent wind. Why such dramatic signs of power? Precisely because the Spirit was **empowering** the disciples for the mission Jesus had given them in Acts 1:8: To be his witnesses “in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” Jesus had known that his followers could only fulfil this mission with the help and power of the Holy Spirit, so he had instructed them to wait in Jerusalem until they were given the Spirit. (Luke 24:49). Just as the Spirit had empowered Jesus for ministry (Luke 4:1), so the Spirit would now empower Jesus’ people for ministry.

Because of Pentecost, Jesus can now be personally present with every believer around the world, through his Holy Spirit. In fact, because the Holy Spirit dwells inside us (1 Cor. 3:16), it is something that can never be taken away. Jesus promised in John 14-16 that the Spirit will give us peace, courage, comfort, and guidance, everything we need.



Series: 40 Days With Jesus

Study 6: Jesus Empowers – Acts 1:1-11 and 2:1-4

Introduction

Jesus' Plan A. There is no plan B, but Plan A has an attachment, the Holy Spirit
Acts 1:4 *“And assembled together with them, Jesus commanded them not to depart from Jerusalem, but wait for the promise of the Father.”*

John 14:16 *“And I will pray the Father and He will give you another Helper, that He may abide with you forever – the Spirit of Truth.”*

. The Meaning Behind Pentecost

Pentecost comes from the Greek word Pentekostos – means fiftieth, here fiftieth day.

Leviticus 23:15-16. After children of Israel redeemed from Egypt, the Lord told Israelites to count fifty days then offer a new grain offering. This became a festival called, Feast of Weeks.

If we count back from Pentecost, we arrive at Easter Sunday, Jesus' Resurrection. This was also a festival 'First Fruits'. 3 days previous was another festival, Passover.

Exodus 12:1, Exodus 19:1, 16. These verses point to the Israelites going to Mt Sinai to receive the law, the Old Covenant. When looking at the Jewish calendar, this also coincides with Pentecost, Feast of Weeks

Joel 2:28&29 and Jeremiah 31:32 both refer to the Lord speaking of a time to come when He will pour out His Spirit. This would be a new covenant written on their hearts.

. Empowering By The Holy Spirit

Acts 2:2-3 Holy Spirit coming with loud noise, mighty wind, tongues of fire – similar to Mt Sanai event Exodus 19:16.

As with the feasts, Passover and First fruits, we find Pentecost or Feast of Weeks, covenant renewal. God is again acting, starting a fresh a New Covenant, law on their hearts. Joel and Jeremiah had prophesied it but God had a specific time planned for it to come into fruition.

. Empowered for Witness

They and we are empowered for witness but as 1 Corinth 1:21-25, some will think is foolish. But we always need to be ready to give an answer for our faith 1 Peter 3:15.

On the day of Pentecost, these people to whom the Spirit was given would never be the same! As Christ said it would, that Spirit of God transformed the disciples from the inside out. Once-timid men were now filled with the very faith and courage of Christ their Savior. It guided them to preach the message of the Gospel boldly. It led them to personal change and growth. The apostle Peter—the same man who had denied Christ three times—now stood up and condemned the multitude for putting to death the Christ, the Son of God, and fearlessly challenged the assembly to repent of their sins (Acts 2:14–39). And the Church grew.



Reflection on Isolation by Anton Zhang, a Mission Aviation Fellowship pilot in Arnhem Land Australia

‘I have been living in remote Arnhem Land for the last year. For the first six months I lived alone, but now I’m sharing a house with my cat Ginger, so I’m no stranger to living in isolation and I’d like to share my thoughts on this from my perspective as a single missionary.

Firstly I’d like to make a distinction between two terms: *isolation* and *solitude*. Isolation is a state of being alone that is a product of our circumstances and perhaps didn’t come by choice; it is not what we’d prefer, but rather is something to ‘deal with’, ‘cope with’ and ‘overcome’.


Solitude on the other hand, is when we choose to be alone for certain purposes. As I’ve journeyed with God, I’ve gradually come to see solitude as a spiritual discipline.

Of course, Scripture calls us to connect with God in community, but it also calls us to do so in the quietness of solitude. At times, we need to stop what we are doing, to take ourselves away from the busyness of our lives, so we can, ‘Be still and know that I am God.’ (Psalm 46:10) Jesus calls us to shut the door of our room and pray to him in secret (Matthew 6:6) and he himself often retreated into solitude to commune with His Father.

So one of the ways I’ve been coping with isolation is by turning my isolation into moments of solitude through which I commune with God, one on one. I take my mind to the peace of the wilderness, free from distraction, and free to think upon the things of God.

As part of this discipline, my solitary activities include prayer and reflecting, journaling, reading, playing the piano and doing art, to the glory of God.



Churches growing in Kosovo; Bibles needed

Kosovo is home to 1.9 million people, of whom 96 percent are Muslim. There are only 500 evangelical Christians and 30 churches.



"As a church, we're focusing on evangelism and discipleship," shares Kosovar-Albanian pastor, Filip. "We need good Christian resources for both. We are thankful to Bible League for providing the 'Reconciliation with God' evangelism

portion and 'Reaching Toward the Goal' discipleship booklet."

"We need more literature in the Albanian language as that feeds the minds of the people and spiritually impacts their lives. **Unfortunately, the Muslim community is way ahead of us. For two years they've invested in a lot in books to strengthen Islam.** The younger generation fall easily for that. We're praying God's Word shall enter every Albanian home in Kosovo."

Nearly all Christian believers in the Kosovo region were formerly Muslim. One of the local converts shares that when he first

converted to Christianity, he and his brother faced harassment and punishment at the hands of his own father.

“We were beaten by him,” he shares. “Many times, he said to us, ‘Go away from my home!’ But my brother and I kept on telling him the truth.”

In Kosovo, there is only one Christian bookshop where Bibles are sold. **It would take at least one entire month for the average person to save up for a Bible.** This is why the gift of a Bible is such an incredible blessing to Christian believers.
