

Messsage From Tony

Abiding As Branches

The image of a branch gaining all its sustenance and strength from the parent vine is a beautiful description of man's total dependence upon God, without whom we can do nothing, for in Him we live and move and have our being.

When Jesus Christ, the Son of God walked the earth, He demonstrated this truth, for He lived His entire life in utter dependence upon the Father. I can do nothing of Myself, He said, I speak only that which I have seen from my Father (John 5:30). Though Jesus Christ was fully God, He lived His life in His humanity. Jesus lived as God intended man to live, in utter dependence upon God.

Christ walked in spirit and truth and only said and did those things that He heard from the Father. He demonstrated how man should live. He lived His life so that the life of God could be lived through the Son of Man in His humanity.

Although Jesus Christ was fully God, He drew all His strength from His Father in heaven, demonstrating how you and I should live our lives as God's children, drawing all our strength from our Lord Jesus Christ. For without Him we can do nothing.

We are to walk in spirit and truth and to do only those things that we hear from Christ our Saviour, so that His life may be lived in us and through us.

Until we humbly confess that in and of ourselves we can do nothing, we will foolishly and unsuccessfully attempt to produce good fruit in our own strength. Let us meditate on this vital principle that Jesus is the vine and we are the branches. We are to abide in Him and allow His Spirit to live His life through us.

Hampton Court Grapevine

You might be surprised to learn that the world's biggest grapevine is not located in France, Spain Italy or any other Mediterranean country where grapes typically thrive. It is in England!

The Hampton Court grapevine was planted in 1768 by Lancelot Brown. Some 120 years later it was measured and found to be four feet around the base. Today this grapevine is 13 feet (almost 4 metres) around the base and the longest branch extends 120 feet. Indeed, the Hampton Court vine is the largest and oldest grapevine in the world. During it's 250 year life time it also outlived six glass green houses that were each built and then dismantled around it.

Throughout the year the vine is carefully pruned, fertilized and thinned by specialists trained in viticulture. Because of this tender care this single grapevine once produced 383 kilograms of delicious black dessert grapes in one year.

Jesus compares himself with the grapevine.

'I am the true vine, and my father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that does not bear fruit He takes away; and every branch that bears fruit He prunes, that it may bear more fruit.' John 15:1

<u>Bible Study, Old Testament Characters – David</u> Loving Your Enemies – 1 Samuel 24:1-22

"I love my enemy. I love God. It's my next door neighbour I can't stand!" "He hurt me so much that I don't think I'll ever be able to forgive him." "Of course I've dealt with my anger and resentment. I just can't stand to be in the room with him."

It's sometimes difficult to love those who have hurt us deeply. Saul slandered and falsely accused David. He hated and feared him because God had anointed David to become king in his place (1 Samuel 16:1-13). In order to protect his power and position, Saul kept trying to kill David. In this chapter we observe David's response

What person, or type of person, do you find difficult to love? Explain

Read 1 Samuel 24:1-22. In what ways did Saul have an overwhelming military advantage over David (vv. 2; 22:2; 23:13)?

In spite of this military advantage, how does David suddenly have the opportunity to kill Saul (vv. 3-4)?

How do his men interpret the circumstances (v. 4)?

If you were in David's position, why might you have been tempted to follow the counsel of your men?

Why do you think David is 'conscience stricken' after cutting off the corner of Saul's robe (vv. 5-6, 10)?

How can viewing our enemy from God's perspective enable us to have a change of heart like David?

How does David's proper understanding of himself and of God's judgement set him free to love his enemy (vv. 8-15)?

How can a similar understanding help us love others more freely?


Describe the powerful effect David's attitude and actions had on Saul (vv. 16-21)

Identify one or two people who might be considered your enemies (for example, someone who irritates you, dislikes you or has hurt you). What practical steps can you take to serve as a channel of God's love to the person(s) you have identified

Expenditure - \$7,931.47; YTD \$15,254.09; YTD weekly average \$1,694.90




Budgeted average weekly offering - \$2,125; Budget required \$19,185.00

Christianity in Iran.

Research by GAMAAN a secular research group in the Netherlands found Christians in Iran are approaching one million (1.55 of population) However, leaders of Christian agencies warn of problems:

Iranians are attracted to Christianity because they think it is part and parcel of the free, secular, and democratic West. (Almost 4 in 10 Iranians drink alcohol, which is forbidden in Islam.)

"Christian" can imply anything from a "vague attraction" to a "genuine love of Christ and a growing knowledge of the Scriptures."


House churches can lack governing structure resulting in false teaching, financial irregularity, and pastoral dictatorship. There is a risk that church growth is outpacing discipleship, exasperated by the fact that many leaders are now in prison, or have been forced out of the country.

Mike Ansari, president of Heart4Iran, says, 'the church is highly marginalized, scattered, and segmented.' He believes personal evangelism is most effective but risky so satellite television has become important.
