

A Word From Tony:

Let God Be God

Ray Stedman writes in response to Romans 9:21-24. 'What Paul is saying in all this is that God may have purposes and objectives that we do not see. And doesn't he have the right to do it? And what if one of those objectives is not only to display his power and his wrath by allowing and permitting man to oppose him and to resist him, but also to display his amazing patience and longsuffering this way? Did you ever think about that? Did you ever think of how, for centuries and centuries, God has put up with the snarling, nasty, blasphemous, accusing remarks of men, and has done nothing to them? He has listened to all the cheap, shoddy, vulgar things that men say about him, and allowed them to treat him with hostility and anger and never does a thing but patiently endure it and put up with it.

Paul says, "What if God does all that. What if it takes that kind of a display of the wrath of God and the patience of God to bring those of us whom he chooses to himself?" Something has to appear to us that makes us understand God. We are not being forced to come to him, we are drawn to him. Therefore we have to respond, and something must make us respond. Is it not the wrath of God and the patience of God that draws us on?

All this, then, is necessary to bring some of us to glory. In other words, for some to be saved, some must be lost. Now, I admit that is an inscrutable mystery. I don't understand it. But I don't have to understand it! That's the whole thing. I can't understand it at this point. There are factors in it which God cannot reveal. He will some day, but he doesn't now -- not because he does not want to, but because I can't handle it. And neither can you. We have to accept it, nevertheless. Paul suggests here that without the display of wrath on God's part, no Gentiles ever would have been saved -- only the elect of Israel, and only a remnant of them. But, as it is, the Gentiles, those of us who never had the advantages that Israel had, are included, as Hosea and Isaiah both predicted.'



Jesus multiplies everyday moments! (From Andy and Cathie Staunton in Cambodia)

In John we read of Jesus' power in multiplying the humble, generous gift of the young boy. Jesus used an everyday meal of loaves and fish to feed 5,000 people. And He used an everyday moment for Layk to hear about Jesus.

One day Cathie wanted a coffee. And so she stopped at a store. It turned out this was Layk's store and it was good coffee! **This moment started a relationship.** Andy and Cathie became friends with Layk and his wife Thea*.

Cathie and Andy started to meet them in everyday moments. Like Jesus did. They ate with Layk and Thea in their home. They spent time in Layk's coffee stall and Cathie spent time with Thea at her hair salon.

Hospitality is important in Cambodia (like in Australia!) and family is part of this. So it was exciting when Layk and Thea came to visit Andy and Cathie one night. Layk ended up bringing his brother-in-law's family as

well (pictured).

God took one stop for coffee and used it to bring Andy and Cathie into contact with many people.

There are very few Khmer followers of Jesus. To find one you'd have to talk to over 300 people! So it was unlikely Layk would ever have met someone who would share the Gospel with him.



But as he spent time with Cathie and Andy he saw something different about them. And he asked them, "I know you follow Jesus. I want to learn more about that... I'm interested to see why you are here."

Layk doesn't know Jesus yet. Please pray that Layk, Thea and their family will come to know Jesus. Pray with us that this is just the start of this story and that a movement will flow out of these moments.
