

A Word From Tony

The History of Australian Baptist Mission

Australian Baptist mission started in 1864 as the activity of individual Baptist colonies in Australia. On 28 October 1882, the first Australian Baptist missionaries, Ellen Arnold and Marie Gilbert, left Adelaide for India. After that, Baptist Missionary Societies in each of the other colonies also sent missionaries to India and then in 1912 those societies formed a federation and the Australian Baptist Foreign Mission ("ABFM") was registered on 1 May 1913 with its headquarters in Adelaide. The work focused on the region of Bengal.

Following World War two, Australian Baptists were challenged to extend their evangelistic passion across the borders of Bengal to neighbouring countries and to people living in Papua New Guinea.

From there Australian Baptist horizons extended to more countries in Asia and Africa. Baptist work among Aboriginal Australians was also entrusted to the mission.

The name of the Mission was changed to the Australian Baptist Missionary Society ("ABMS") in 1959 and the current name, Global Interaction, was adopted in August 2002.

For nearly 140 years, God has used the Mission staff to contribute to the transformation of the lives of many people groups. Around 1,800 active faith communities are operating with a formal membership of more than 150,000 believers and a wide range of medical, health and development initiatives are now led by national churches.

- 8. My kids need to be able to make their own decisions about what sports to follow.


Church Fellowship Camp

Staunton's New Ministry Project

In their latest newsletter, Andy and Cathie shared about a new project they are planning. This involves leasing a building to provide training in literacy, small business incubation and skill-based training. The centre will also be used as a coffee shop. Also, they have purchased a rickshaw which is being converted into a coffee cart. They plan to employ some locals to run the café and coffee cart but also to provide mentoring and discipleship for the workers and families. This is one way Andy and Cathie see that they can be more involved in the Chreav village local community. Also, with discussions I have had with Andy, they also hope

to commence a Christian Church in

the village.

They are also building a swimming pool next to their house and plan to set up a swimming school. (Drowning are an issue in the community.)



Please pray for our neighbours

Indonesia is currently reporting the highest number of new cases of COVID 19 per day in the world, exceeding the rates of India and Brazil.

Active infections – approximately 650,000, with more than 20,000 deaths in July alone. Over 250,000 children have tested positive for COVID-19. 7 to 12 years old are the most affected (28 per cent), followed by the 16 to 18 age group (25 per cent) and the 13 to 15 age group (19 per cent). Child mortality has reached 3 to 5 per cent, which could be the highest in the world according to the World Health Organisation.

Overall data is indicating that Indonesia could have a death rate three times higher than the global average right now.



Please be in prayer regarding the current problems in Afghanistan, especially in relation to the Taliban moving very quickly taking over towns and cities. Pray for governments like the USA and Australia as they seek to safely evacuate foreign nationals and locals who provided support during the 20 years of conflict. Pray also for those who remain in Afghanistan, especially women and children. Pray for the protection and God's presence for believers who are in danger there and in surrounding nations.

Pray for those affected by the Haiti earthquake and the agencies providing aid to them.

Praise the Lord that the Stauntons - Andy, Cathie, Charlie, Ruby and Hugo have been able to remain in Cambodia during the COVID pandemic and have been kept safe and healthy.


Pray for Andy and Cathie as they seek to commence new Ministry projects in Chreav Village supporting locals but also seeking opportunities to share about God's love for them.
