A Word From Tony

Being Subject to Authorities

In Romans 12, Paul described what it meant for believers to be a living-sacrifice. In short, it mostly has to do with setting ourselves aside to serve the Lord, each other, and even our enemies in love.

Then in Chapter 13, Paul turns to the issue of how Christians who are saved by God's grace should interact with our present governments. He describes the biblical doctrine of being subject to human authorities, something Peter also teaches (1 Peter 2:13–17). Again, those in Christ are called to set themselves aside and to trust God to provide some of our practical needs through those in authority.


Paul is clear that this applies to every person, “every soul”. He calls for us to be subject to government authorities, though he does not say that we must obey them in all cases. Paul and the other apostles refused to obey commands from people in authority to stop preaching the gospel, for instance (Acts 5:27–29). They did, however, submit to those in authority in all matters that were not in contradiction to the will of God.

Why should we be subject to authorities? Paul is clear: All authorities have been established by God. This would include, of course, good leaders, evil leaders, and everyone in-between. Paul's instruction here, then, is not about blind nationalism or absolute obedience to men. Rather, it is a recognition that human government, in general, is a legitimate authority, and that Christians cannot use their faith as an excuse for civil lawlessness.

And before we start to complain, we should remember that Paul is writing this letter to Christians in Rome. The government of Rome ruled much of the known world at the time. It was led by the Emperor Nero who was famous for his cruel and unfair treatment of Christians, among other groups. We must not assume that Paul is writing these words lightly. He was aware of the implications of his teaching.

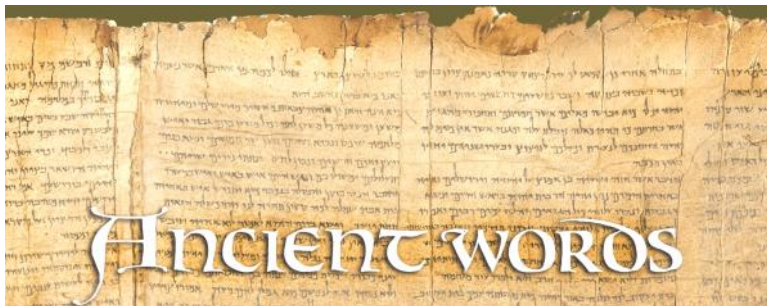

Prison Fellowship have been running the Angel Tree program for over 30 years in Victoria. This program offers parents in prison a gift to be sent to their child, on their behalf at Christmas time.



This year has been particularly difficult for many incarcerated parents as family visits have been cancelled due to COVID. They expect to have about 1,500 requests for gifts from parents in prison.

The parent completes a form with details of their children and can include a message to the child. We will be given details of children in late November with their name, age and gift suggestions. For the sake of equality, the gifts should be around \$30.

All those who are given contact details of families need to have a Working with Children Check card.
