We then who are strong ought to bear with the scruples of the weak, and not please ourselves. Let each of us please his neighbour for his good, leading to edification. Romans 15:1-2

A Word From Tony

Not Just Pleasing Ourselves

As we turn to Romans 15 today, we find Paul continues writing to the early church about how those he describes as "strong" in their faith ought to treat those who are comparatively "weak" in their faith (Romans 14:1).

This is in the context of those issues where the Bible is not explicitly clear, such as eating meat, drinking alcohol, or observing certain holidays (Romans 14:2; 14:21). Those who are more legalistic on such matters Paul has described as "weak in faith," not recognizing their freedom in Christ. But we need to note, Paul has made it clear that both groups are Christians. Both are trusting in Christ for their salvation.

The difference between the weak and the strong, as Paul has defined it, is that the strong are fully convinced that in Christ they have been freed from the restrictions of the law, including the dietary restrictions about food and drink. Their strong faith that Christ has fully satisfied all the requirements of the law allows them to feel comfortable with eating or drinking anything.

However, to those strong in their faith, Paul has written that they must be willing to set aside their freedom in certain situations in order to avoid leading their less strong brothers and sisters into that sin (Romans 14:13).

In short, those strong in the faith must put a low priority on pleasing themselves, placing it below their obligation to serve weaker Christians. And this remains a challenge for us all today, as Paul has previously encouraged us in Romans 12:10 "*Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honour giving preference to one another.*"

It was agreed that the fulltime Pastoral Stipend be increased in line with the average change in CPI and WPI, resulting in an increase of \$19 per week in 2022 to \$1669.

It was agreed that the weekly superannuation contribution be moved from \$206.98 to \$208 in 2022.

Jo-Anne Bradshaw and Fiona Hall were accepted to continue service on the Union Council of the Baptist Union of Victoria.

Paul Holdway was appointed as BUV Honorary Legal Advisor for a period of 12 months from 15th October 2021. Graham Dangerfield was reappointed as CEO of Baptcare.
