Shake Off The Vipers

Acts 27:39-28:10 NIV

A. Paul On His Journey

- 1. Paul desired Rome. He felt this was where the Holy Spirit was calling him to.
- 2. Now, he was finally going there, but as a prisoner.
- 3. Many trials awaited him in Rome.
- 4. Even so, he would have great success there. (see Acts 28:30-31)

B. God Protected Paul

- 1. The ship carrying Paul to Rome ran into severe storms.
- 2. The storm was so bad even the experienced sailors feared for their lives.
- 3. Paul was cared for & comforted by an angel in the storm (Acts 27:22-25)
- 4. This shows God's protection from natural storms.
- 5. Paul was the only one with a word from the Lord.
- 6. Our Lord has also promised to be with us in the storms of life.
- 7. Paul went from shipwreck to survival, and miraculous signs followed.
- 8. The ship was destroyed, but lives were saved—God's promise still held.
- 9. This shows that a shipwreck doesn't mean defeat.
- 10. Sometimes we arrive at our destiny floating on broken pieces.
- 11. Be encouraged. Even in chaos, God's plan is intact.
- 12. Have you ever made it through something you thought would break you?

C. Protection From The Soldiers (V. 42)

- 1. The soldiers intended to kill all the prisoners to stop them escaping.
- 2. Christians have suffered much persecution throughout history.
- 3. Starting with the early church with the Jewish leaders, and by Rome.
- 3. Today throughout the world, many believers' face persecution.
- 4. Paul was bound for Rome, but shipwrecked and stranded on an island.
- 5. Every person aboard was alive, saved for Paul's sake.
- 6. God has often spared or blessed many for the sake of a faithful few. (Gen. 18:27-33; 26:24; 39:5; I Kings l l:11-13; 2 Kings8:19)
- 7. How important are you to your country? Or your country to you?

D. A Viper Attacks Paul

- 1. Arriving on Malta, they were met by kind natives, a warm fire, & trouble.
- 2. A viper comes out of the fire & bites Paul.
- 3. Vipers often appear out of the fires of life
- 4. Times of trouble make us vulnerable; God has given us a promise (Isa. 43:2)
- 5. Paul shook off the viper when attacked, and so should we.
- 6. This shows God's protection from supernatural storms.
 - a. The serpent is often seen as a symbol of the devil.
 - b. This one came out of the fire and attached itself to Paul.
- 5. First, the locals thought he would die, then they worshiped him as a god.

- 6. As believers. we are guaranteed God's protection from the serpents.
- 7. Limits on the tempter (1Cor. 10:13) The One in us is greater. (1John 4:4)
- 8. No place is as safe as in the perfect will of God.
- 9. We are protected until our work is done, then heaven awaits.

E. Shake Off the Viper of Discouragement

- 1. Paul was attacked while helping ... doing good, gathering sticks for fire.
- 2. Vipers often appear when we're doing the right thing.
- 3. Paul shook off the viper, remembering God's promise of safety.
- 4. Let God's promises deliver you; shake off any doubt or discouragement.
- 5. Don't fall for the trap of doubting God because your life isn't perfect.
- 6. It could be God is using the situation to develop something in your life.
- 7. The viper represents unexpected attacks—criticism, illness, betrayal.
- 8. People expected Paul to fall—but he didn't.
- 9. Your survival isn't just for you—it's also a sign to others.

F. Shake Off the Viper of Criticism (v. 4)

- 1. It is interesting when we look at the reaction of those around Paul.
- 2. The vocal ones are the critics: "No doubt this man is a murderer"
- 3. Many are quick to judge and falsely accuse.
- 4. Are you being wrongly judged, falsely accused? You are not the first!
- 3. Jesus was constantly criticized
 - a. He was called a blasphemer (Matt. 9:3)
 - b. He was accused of being in league with Satan (Matt. 9:34)
- 4. Remember how Jesus responded to His critics (1 Peter 2:23)
- 5. Shake off the viper of criticism by looking to Jesus (Heb. 12:1-2)

G. Shake Off the Viper of Low Expectations (v. 6)

- 1. The natives expected Paul to swell up and die.
- 2. Some have low expectations of Christians, thinking you'll stumble & fall.
- 3. Shake off the faithless conclusions of others.
- 4. Prove them wrong by being faithful to your Lord.
- 5. Jesus came to give us abundant life with rewards that will endure forever.
- 6. The Holy Spirit has equipped us to have daily victory despite the opposition.
- 7. Surrender then to the Lord and let him have his way with your life.

H. Shake Off Those Vipers and Experience the Joy of the Lord

- 1. Paul was rewarded for his faithfulness, performing many miracles.
- 2. When you survive the venom, you carry healing for others.
- 3. God uses what tried to kill you to empower you, & others.
- 4. Your story—shipwreck and all—is the sermon someone needs.
- 5. What we do with what bites us determines the outcome.
- 6. Shake off rejection, shake off bitterness, shake off discouragement.
- 7. What needs shaking off in your life today?
