THREE GREAT PROMISES

John 14:1-21 NIV

14 "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me. ² My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you? ³ And if I go & prepare a place for you, I will come back & take you to be with me that you also may be where I am. ⁴ You know the way to the place where I am going." ⁵ Thomas said to him, "Lord, we don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?"

- ⁶ Jesus answered, "I am the way & the truth & the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. ⁷ If you really know me, you will know my Father as well. From now on, you do know him & have seen him."
- ⁸ Philip said, "Lord, show us the Father & that will be enough for us."
- ⁹ Jesus answered: "Don't you know me, Philip, even after I have been among you such a long time? Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? ¹⁰ Don't you believe that I am in the Father, & that the Father is in me? The words I say to you I do not speak on my own authority. Rather, it is the Father, living in me, who is doing his work. ¹¹ Believe me when I say that I am in the Father & the Father is in me; or at least believe on the evidence of the works themselves. ¹² Very truly I tell you, whoever believes in me will do the works I have been doing, & they will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father. ¹³ And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. ¹⁴ You may ask me for anything in my name, & I will do it.

¹⁵ "If you love me, keep my commands. ¹⁶ And I will ask the Father, & he will give you another advocate to help you & be with you forever— ¹⁷ the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you & will be in you. ¹⁸ I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you. ¹⁹ Before long, the world will not see me anymore, but you will see me. Because I live, you also will live. ²⁰ On that day you will realize that I am in my Father, & you are in me, & I am in you. ²¹ Whoever has my commands & keeps them is the one who loves me. The one who loves me will be loved by my Father, & I too will love them & show myself to them."

Introduction:

- 1. **Context**: Setting is the last night of Jesus' life.

- 3. The city prepared by Jesus will surpass earthly beauty, free from the scars of sin.
- 4. Various biblical descriptions offer glimpses of Heaven's glory.
- 5. Like in Bunyan's *Pilgrim's Progress*, believers are on a journey to a Heavenly City.
- 6. The many rooms indicate Jesus' personal care for each believer's eternal future.
- 7. When everything is ready, Jesus will return for His followers.
- 8. Heaven will lack all the sufferings experienced since the fall.
- 9. The ultimate goal is eternal presence with Jesus.
- 10. Faith is foundational & brings confidence during uncertainty.

II. I Will Answer Your Prayer (John 14:13-14)

- 1. Jesus assures that help is available beyond the promise of heaven.
- 2. Disciples had great faith & made sacrifices to follow Jesus.
- 3. Jesus promises that help will be available through prayer.
- 4. Praying in Jesus' name aligns requests with His character & will, bringing glory to the Father.
- 5. The promise of answered prayers is not a blank cheque for selfish desires but to align with God's will, His power & love, aligning with His kingdom purposes.
- 6. Believers are encouraged to pray boldly, trusting in Jesus' wisdom & love.
- 7. Believers, empowered by the Holy Spirit, will do greater works reflecting the church's global impact.

III. I Will Be With You (John 14:16-18)

- 1. Jesus prepares His disciples for His departure by promising the Holy Spirit.
- 2. The Holy Spirit will be the Advocate, Helper, & Comforter for believers.
- 3. Jesus assures His presence within believers through the Holy Spirit.
- 4. Jesus reassures that believers will not be abandoned & left as orphans.
- 5. The Holy Spirit's presence enables believers to face life with confidence & joy.
- 6. Jesus describes a unified relationship between Himself, the Father, & believers.
- 7. Obedience & keeping Jesus' commands is a sign of love & relationship with Him.
- 8. Holy Spirit's presence is permanent, providing ongoing guidance & empowerment.
- 9. Believers' unity with Jesus & the Father is a source of strength & life.

Application:

- 1. Trusting in Jesus' promise of a prepared place in heaven allows us to live with assurance, filling believers with hope & confidence.
- 2. Faith in Jesus helps navigate life's challenges without being overwhelmed.

- 3. Live in anticipation of Jesus' return & the promise of eternal life.
- 4. Expect great things through prayer, believe in Jesus' power & willingness to respond.
- 5. Prayers should honour God & align with His kingdom purposes, reflecting our relationship with Jesus.
- 6. Show love for Jesus by living according to His teachings & seeking the Holy Spirit's guidance.
- 7. Trust in Jesus' continued presence through the Holy Spirit always.
- 8. Live out the reality of your union with Jesus, striving to know Him more intimately through love & obedience.
