## The Hope of the Coming Messiah

#### Isaiah 7:14; 9:1-7

## A. Old Testament Prophecy Is Crucial to the Gospel Message

- 1. The Gospel is "according to the Scriptures" (1 Cor. 15:3-4)
- 2. Christmas then is a good time to study these prophecies

### B. Isaiah And Prophecies About Jesus

- 1. The most eloquent of the prophets speaking of Christ's birth.
- 2. He prophesied during a time of great darkness, oppression, and turmoil.
- 3. Assyria was threatening Israel, and the people needed hope and deliverance.
- 4. This passage speaks of God's promise of light in the darkness.
- 5. (v2): "The people walking in darkness have seen a great light".
- 6. Christ, the Light of the World, is the ultimate fulfillment of this prophecy.
- 7. He came into the world & would bring the joy of salvation to all who are lost.
- 8. This joy is still a reality for believers today.
- 9. The Messiah's rule will bring deliverance from sin & freedom from oppression.
- 10. Christ's victory over sin, death, and evil is already won. It is complete!
- 11. There will be no more war. His peace will reign forever.
- 12. We are called to live in the peace and freedom that He offers.
- 13. Let us consider his wonderful introduction to the Savior
- 14. Isaiah revealed the following about Jesus

## C. His Miraculous Birth (7:14)

- 1. Isaiah prophesied the virgin birth of Christ
- 2. The virgin birth was a miracle.
- 3. "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given"
- 4. A humble birth, but one that carries the weight of God's plan for salvation.
- 5. Miracles surrounding this central miracle
  - a. The angelic announcements (Luke 1:13-20,26-38; 2:8-14; Matt. 1:20-23)
  - b. The timing of the taxing (Luke 2:1)
  - c. The arrival of the wise men (Matt. 2:1-18)
- 6. The greatest miracle was the Incarnation (Phil. 2:5-7)
  - a. The miraculous virgin birth was a sign
  - b. The name "Immanuel" (God with us) announced the Incarnation

# D. He Is Given Many Names & Titles (9:6)

- 1. Wonderful Counsellor: He provides divine wisdom and guidance.
- 2. Wonderful in His birth, His life, His death, and resurrection
- 3. Counsellor who understands us
  - a. He cares and is capable and compassionate
  - b. No problem too big for Him to handle
- 4. Mighty God: He is the powerful Creator and Sustainer of the universe.

- 5. All things are possible with Him
  - a. Even the wind and waves were subject to Him
  - b. Death could not hold Him
- 6. The everlasting Father reflects His care and provision for His people.
- 7. It also reflects A term reflecting the Messiah's eternal nature.
  - a. "Before Abraham was, I am" (John 8:58)
  - b. Offered everlasting life (John 3:16; 5:24
- 8. The Prince of Peace brings peace (John 14:27)
- 9. He is the source of lasting peace, both with God and among humanity.
  - a. Peace with God (Rom. 5:1)
  - b. The peace of God (Phil. 4:6-7)

### E. His Magnificent Kingdom (9:7)

- 1. His government to bring peace to the world
- 2. He will sit upon the throne of David (Luke:32-33)
- 3. Justice will be found throughout His kingdom.
- 4. Other prophecies of Isaiah about this kingdom.
  - a. The poor will receive equity (11:4)
  - b. Enmity between animals ended (11:6-7)
  - c. No more danger to man from animals (11:8)
  - d. Violence taken from the earth (11:9)
  - e. The entire earth becomes productive (35:1-7)
  - f. Great joy characterizes His kingdom (35:10)
- 5. The Kingdom will have no end, The Messiah will reign forever
- 6. He will establish justice, righteousness, & peace in His kingdom.
- 7. Christ's kingdom is not of this world, but it is everlasting.
- 8. We, as believers, are citizens of that kingdom.

#### F. Conclusion

- 1. This passage looks at the Hope of the Messiah's Coming.
- 2. Isaiah 9:1-7 gives us a glimpse into the coming of the Savior—Jesus Christ.
- 3. He brings light to our darkness, rules with justice, & offers peace and salvation.
- 4. In the midst of our own struggles and darkness, we are reminded of the hope that Christ brings.
- 5. His light, His rule, and His eternal peace are available to all who trust in Him.
- 6. If you are walking in darkness, the light of Christ is available to you.
- 7. He came to save and offer eternal peace.
- 8. Accept His light today and live in the joy and freedom He provides.
- 9. Receive Him by Faith and Know Our Wonderful Lord
