## "New Year: What If?"

Acts 4:23-33

- A. Closing the Old Year 2024 Has Gone
  - 1. 2024 was a year of change in the world.
  - 2. It may have been difficult for you.
  - 3. Whatever it was, it is behind us now.
- B. Two Words for the New Year: "What if!"
  - 1. 2025 is a blank slate.
  - 2. Let's make it a year of adventure and faith.
- C. What If This Is the Year of New Beginnings?
  - 1. Two great beginnings for the early church.
  - 2. Acts 2: Pentecost & Acts 4: Starting again with thousands of converts.
  - 3. The year you rededicate (1 John 1:9) & return to your first love (Rev. 2:4-5).
  - 4. The year you stop looking back and look up to Jesus (Heb. 12:2).
- D. What If This Is the Year Your Prayers Are Answered?
  - 1. "When they had prayed...the place was shaken."
  - 2. The year your family gets right with God.
  - 3. The year you conquer your negative attitude.
  - 4. The year God restores your health, wealth, and relationships.
- E. What If This Is the Year of Revival in Your Church?
  - 1. "They were all filled with the Holy Spirit."
  - 2. "Revival" is a misunderstood word.
  - 3. It is not so much an external change; it starts with an internal experience.
  - 4. Revival would make this a year of forgiveness, sharing, & reconciliation.
  - 5. Revival would make this the year when all barriers fall.
- F. What If This Is the Year of Evangelism?
  - 1. "With great power gave the apostles witness of the resurrection of Lord Jesus."
  - 2. Here is the greatest lack in churches today.
  - 3. How long has it been since you tried to win a soul?
  - 4. The year of personal witnessing and soul winning.
- G. The New Birth Makes All Things New
  - 1. A good time to become aware of personal sin (Rom. 3:23).
  - 2. A good time to believe that God loves us (Rom. 5:8).
  - 3. A good time to respond to that by receiving Christ as Saviour (Rom. 10:9-10).
- H. Where Does This Lead?
  - 1. How do I please the Lord in daily living?
  - 2. Where shall I draw the line on questionable activities?
  - 3. Draw the line on anything that is not expedient.
  - 4. Paul reminds us that the Christian life is a new life (1 Cor 6:11; 2 Cor 5:17).
  - 5. All things are lawful: not saved by keeping the law.
  - 6. All things are not expedient. a. Expedient: that which helps along. b. Not all things contribute to growth in the Christian life.

- 7. Will this make me love Christ more?
- 8. Will this enable me to serve Christ more effectively?
- I. Draw the Line on Anything That Enslaves You
  - 1. There is wonderful freedom in Christ.
  - 2. All things are in my power...but I will not be overpowered.
  - All things permitted but... a. Money is lawful...but I will not be under its power.
    b. Recreation is lawful...but not to be our master. c. Political power is lawful...but not to rule us.
  - 4. Let nothing become your master (1 Cor 6:12).
- J. Draw the Line on Anything That Does Not Edify
  - 1. Not all things build up.
  - 2. Who are we to be building up?
  - 3. Will this build up others in the family of God?
  - 4. If not, we must leave it out of our lives.
- K. The Threefold Test of All We Do and Say in This New Year
  - 1. Does it help me along in my Christian life?
  - 2. John Wesley: "Whatever cools my affection towards Christ is of the world."
  - 3. Wilbur Chapman: "Anything that dims my vision of Christ, or takes away my taste for Bible study, or cramps my prayer life, or makes Christian work more difficult is wrong for me."
  - 4. Will it allow me to remain free or will it become my master?
  - 5. Does it build up others?
- L. What If? Consider Two More Words: "Why Not?"
  - 1. "With God nothing shall be impossible" (Luke 1:37).
  - 2. All these good things can happen in your life.
