Come Back To The Lord

Hosea 6:1-6

6 "Come, let us return to the Lord. He has torn us to pieces but he will heal us; he has injured us but he will bind up our wounds. ² After two days he will revive us; on the third day he will restore us, that we may live in his presence. ³ Let us acknowledge the Lord; let us press on to acknowledge him. As surely as the sun rises, he will appear; he will come to us like the winter rains, like the spring rains that water the earth." ⁴ "What can I do with you, Ephraim? What can I do with you, Judah? Your love is like the morning mist, like the early dew that disappears. ⁵ Therefore I cut you in pieces with my prophets, I killed you with the words of my mouth— then my judgments go forth like the sun. ⁶ For I desire mercy, not sacrifice, and acknowledgment of God rather than burnt offerings.

A. The Bible Is A Book of Invitations

- 1. From Genesis to Revelation, God offers invitations.
- 2. God's arms are always open to the repentant.

B. The Call To Return To The Lord (V.1-2)

- 1. Hosea recognized our need for God & calls his people to return to the Lord.
- 2. The people of Israel were suffering the consequences of their rebellion.
- 3. Israel is called to return to God after experiencing His discipline.
- 4. They acknowledge that only God can heal and restore.
- 5. God's correction is not for destruction but for redemption.
- 6. There is the promise of revival & restoration.
- 7. Just as a doctor treats wounds, God heals the brokenness of our lives.
- 8. An invitation to those who have known the closeness of the Lord.
 - a. To "Return" means to go back to where you were, a better time.
 - b. Do you remember a time of closer fellowship with the Lord?
 - c. A time when the joy of the Lord was more real? prayer more meaningful?
 - d. A time when church services were more exciting?
 - e. A time when you cared more for souls?
- 9. These believers had left their first love for the Lord.
- 10. Many today choose the love of the world over the love of God.

C. An Invitation to Those Who Have Felt the Chastening of the Lord

- 1. He disciplines those He loves (Heb. 12:5-6)
- 2. God restores life and renews His people.
- 3. Sin had become a way of life for these people (4:1-2)
- 4. An invitation to backsliders to come back to the Lord
- 5. God restores life and renews His people.
- 6. God loves us in spite of our backsliding
 - a. He will revive us & raise us up
 - b. We shall live in His sight

- 7. Seek to know God more deeply and live in the hope of His promises.
- 8. Like the morning rain refreshing the earth, God's presence renews our spirits.
- 9. The image of revival & raising up points to God's promise to renew His people.
- 10. Return to the Lord while you have time to respond to His call

D. God Is Committed To Us

- 1. In turn, God desires Total Commitment, not a Superficial Repentance.
- 2. A steadfast love, a committed love, not fleeting faithfulness.
- 3. Israel's love for God was inconsistent, like a mist that quickly vanishes.
- 4. Examine your own commitment, is it a shallow devotion?
- 5. Are you offering God true devotion or temporary passion?
- 6. A plant not watered consistently will die; so does a faith that's not nurtured.
- 7. God is Seeking an Ongoing Relationship.
- 8. The call is not just to return once but to "press on" in knowing the Lord.
- 9. God desires faithful love not a fleeting devotion.
- 10. A true relationship with God is built on steadfast love, not momentary emotions.
- 11. Christ was totally committed. He was torn and smitten for us (Isa. 53)
- 12. This shows the love Jesus has for us all. Do we return His love?
- 13. Do we show His love in what we do & how we interact with people?
- 14. Do we "share" with others of the love of God?
- 15. The primary human "organ" that shows our love isn't the mouth. It's our ears.
- 16. Listening to people doesn't mean we agree with everything they believe.
- 17. ... but it shows people that we care about them personally.

E. God's True Desire: Mercy Over Sacrifice (v. 6)

- 1. God values a genuine relationship over empty rituals.
- 2. Sacrifices without love and obedience mean nothing to God.
- 3. Pursue a life marked by mercy, compassion, and true knowledge of God.
- 4. A gift without love is meaningless, but love expressed in action pleases God.
- 5. Sacrifices were meant to reflect a heart devoted to God.
- 6. Israel performed rituals without true love.
- 7. God wants a heart of love, mercy, & relationship over empty religious acts.

F. Come to Him and He Will Restore Your Soul (Ps. 23)

- 1. God is always ready to heal, restore, and revive those who earnestly seek Him.
- 2. This is a call to authentic faith, returning to God with true repentance.
- 3. Acknowledge where we have strayed and seek His healing.
- 4. Commit to knowing him daily. Live out genuine love and mercy.
- 5. Spiritual growth requires ongoing pursuit of God's presence.
- 6. Our faith must be reflected in how we treat others.
- 7. God calls us to return to Him, not in words or rituals but in true, steadfast love.
- 8. May we press on to know Him deeply and live in faithful obedience.
