Come and Be Safe

John 6:25-40

A. D. L. Moody's Favourite Text

- 1. This is a text that was a favourite of Dwight L. Moody.
- 2. A text in which he found assurance & made him feel secure.
- 3. It brings out that Jesus is the true source of eternal security and satisfaction.

B. A Tender Invitation

- 1. "He who comes to me"
- 2. Jesus invites us to come to Him, to receive Him.
- 3. There is nothing complicated about this invitation
 - a. Nothing about religious ceremony
 - b. Nothing about good works
 - c. Nothing about giving money
- 4. We have all been invited to come to Jesus.

C. The Search for Security (John 6:25-27)

- 1. The reading today follows on from 2 distinct miracles.
- 2. First, we have the feeding of the 5000.
- 3. Then came the amazing miracle of the walking on water.
- 4. We see the crowd were searching for Jesus (John 6:25-27)
- 5. This was more to satisfy their materialistic expectations, rather than recognising the signs of the arrival of the Messiah through the miracles He performed.
- 6. He encouraged them to seek eternal sustenance rather than temporary satisfaction.
- 7. The crowd followed Jesus because He had fed them, focussing on temporary needs.
- 8. Many seek safety in material things—money, health, success—things that do not last.
- 8. The people wanted another sign similar to the manna given to their ancestors.9. Jesus explained that the true bread from heaven is given by God.
- 10. Jesus pointed them to Himself as the true Bread of Life.
- 11. Jesus' declaration: "I am the bread of life."
- 12. Just as bread sustains physical life, Jesus alone sustains spiritual life.
- 13. This is significant in the context of their spiritual hunger.
- 14. Jesus is the bread that gives life to the world, crowd wanted this bread always.
- 15. He promised never hungering spiritually by coming & believing in Him.
- 16. What are you seeking for security in life? Where do you find satisfaction?
- 17. Are you looking for the Bread that perishes or the Bread that endures?
- 18. Only in Christ can your soul be truly safe and satisfied.

D. The Work of Faith (John 6:28-29)

- 1. The people asked, "What must we do to do the works of God?"
- 2. Jesus' answer: Believe in Him whom God has sent.
- 3. This is a call to believe in Jesus.

- 4. Belief in Jesus is a matter of faith and trust.
- 5. As Eph 2:8-9 says: Safety in Christ is not earned by works but by faith.
- 6. Are you trusting in your own efforts, or have you placed your faith in Christ?

E. To Come to Jesus Is to Be Received by Him

- 1. "I shall lose none of all those he has given me"
- 2. Those who come find Christ's arms open wide to receive them
- 3. Here is a two-way meeting:
 - a. A seeking sinner meets a seeking Savior
 - b. A receiving sinner meets a receiving Savior
- 4. Receiving Christ is placing faith in Him
 - a. We become aware of our sinful condition (Rom. 3:23)
 - b. We understand we cannot save ourselves (Titus 3:5)
 - c. We stop trying to earn favour with God (Eph. 2:8-9)
 - e. We trust in the Lord Jesus Christ as personal Saviour
 - d. The moment we meet we become the children of God. (John 1:12)
 - e. We become heirs of God, joint heirs with Christ (Rom. 8:17)
 - f. We will never be separated from His love.
- 5. Every day then becomes an adventure in faith.

F. To Come to Jesus Is to Receive Eternal Life from Him

- 1. "...whoever comes to me I will never drive away. ..."
- 2. The verses that follow seal this promise (vv. 38--40)
 - a. Christ came to do the Father's will (v. 38)
 - b. The Father wills that not one believer be lost (v. 39)
 - c. The Father wills that all believers be resurrected. (v. 39)
 - d. The Father wills that all believers have everlasting life (v. 40)
- 3. They are safe in His arms & have that assurance of salvation
- 4. Jesus promises whoever comes to Him will never be cast out or driven away.
- 5. Jesus came to do the Father's will—to give eternal life to all who believe.
- 6. We can be assured that those who come to Jesus are secure in Him forever.
- 7. Have you come to Jesus? Do you have the assurance that you are safe in Him?

G. Conclusion:

- 1. Jesus invites us to come and be safe in Him.
- 2. He is the true Bread of Life. Will you trust Him today?
- 3. He is the only One who can satisfy our souls & secure our eternity.
- 4. Come to Him today. He will never cast you out.
- 5. Come just as you are to receive and be received today.
