# The Unfailing Love of God

# Ephesians 3:10-21

## Introduction

- 1. There is a truth that's central to our Christian faith, God's unfailing love for us.
- 2. This love is unlike any love we experience in this world.
- 3. It is unconditional, sacrificial, eternal, and transformative.
- 4. Allow this truth to sink deeply into your heart.
- 5. Because when we truly grasp the depth of God's love, it changes everything.
- 6. It changes how we view ourselves, how we live, & how we relate to others.

## A. God's Love Is Unconditional

- 1. We live in a world where love is often conditional.
- 2. People tend to love based on how we perform, look, or how we treat them.
- 3. It's not based on actions, or performance, or our worthiness. It's unconditional.
- 4. Romans 5:8: "But God demonstrates His own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us."
- 5. His love isn't based on our goodness but on His nature.
- 6. The prodigal son (Luke 15:11-32) took his inheritance & wasted it recklessly.
- 7. Then returned to his father, broke, broken, and ashamed.
- 8. The father didn't demand an apology but ran to him, embraced him, & said,
- 9. "For this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found"
- 10. That's the unconditional love of God.
- 11. It is love that chases us down, even when we wander far from Him.
- 12. Many of us may feel unworthy of love because of our mistakes or failures.
- 13. God's love for you does not depend on your worthiness, it depends on His grace.
- 14. You are loved just as you are, no matter what you've done.

### B. God's Love Is Sacrificial

- 1. True love requires sacrifice. It isn't about getting what we want.
- 2. It's about giving of ourselves for the good of another.
- 3. God's love for us is the greatest example of sacrificial love.
- 4. John 3:16 tells us, "For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life."
- 5. God's love isn't just a feeling—it's a love that gave up something precious.
- 6. He gave us His only Son to die for us, even though we didn't deserve it.
- 7. Think about a parent who sacrifices everything to provide for their children.
- 8. Time, resources, & even their own comforts to ensure their children are cared for.
- 9. Jesus' sacrifice on the cross was the ultimate act of love.
- 10. He gave His life for us, not because we were worthy, but because He wanted us to experience eternal life with Him.
- 11. God's love calls us to live sacrificially as well.
- 12. As we've received this immense love, we are called to give it to others.
- 13. The heart of love is sacrifice loving others the way God has loved us.

# C. God's Love Is Eternal and Unchanging

- 1. In human relationships, love can sometimes feel fleeting.
- 2. People may love us one day and turn away the next.
- 3. But God's love is different—it is eternal and unchanging.
- 4. He loved us before we were born, and He will love us for all eternity.
- 5. Jeremiah 31:3: "I have loved you with an everlasting love; I have drawn you with unfailing kindness."
- 6. God's love isn't a temporary feeling; it is an everlasting covenant.
- 7. It does not change because of our circumstances, mistakes, or weaknesses.
- 8. God's love remains constant, steady, and unshakable.
- 9. In the Bible, we see that Israel's relationship with God was often marked by rebellion and disobedience, despite this, God continued to love them.
- 10. Even when they worshipped other gods, God's love remained steadfast.
- 11. His commitment was not dependent on their behaviour but on His character.
- 12. Take comfort in knowing that
- 13. No matter what happens in His love remains constant. God's love will never fail.
- 14. When so much is uncertain, we can rely on the truth that God's love is eternal.

#### D. God's Love Is Transformative

- 1. God's love is not just something we feel; it's something that changes us.
- 2. It empowers us to live differently and love others as He has loved us.
- 3. 1 John 4:19: "We love because He first loved us."
- 4. God's love doesn't just inspire us—
- 5. As we experience His love, we are changed. His love enables us.
- 6. Saul was a man who persecuted Christians.
- 7. After encountering God on the road to Damascus, he was radically changed.
- 8. He became the Apostle Paul, sharing God's love everywhere he went.
- 9. When you experience God's love, it doesn't just affect your heart.
- 10. God's love has the power to change everything.
- 11. The love of God has the power to transform you.

#### E. Conclusion:

- 1. God's love for us is unconditional, sacrificial, eternal, and transformative.
- 2. This love is the foundation of our faith. It's not just a theological concept.
- 3. It is a reality that we are called to experience and share with others.
- 4. God's love for you is deep, wide, long, and high.
- 5. It covers mistakes, fills our heart with peace, & empowers us to live differently.
- 6. If you've never committed through faith in Jesus Christ, today is the day.
- 7. He's offering you His unconditional, sacrificial love.
- 8. Believers: Recommit to living in response to God's love.
- 9. Let His eternal love guide your life.
- 10. Go & share that love with others loving not just in word, but in action.
- 11. May we all experience the depth & breadth of God's love.
- 12. Then in turn, live as people transformed by it.
