From Death to Life: The Amazing Grace of God

Ephesians 2:1-10

A. Introduction

- 1. When we look at a passage, & try to understand it, we need to know the context.
- 2. Paul is writing a letter to the Ephesian church.
- 3. He is encouraging them to understand their position in Christ.
- 4. The passage highlights both the problem and the solution they face in life.
- 5. The problem is spiritual death, while the solution is grace through Christ.
- 6. Many years ago, Pauline & I heard a live testimony of Johnny Lee Clary.

B. The Reality of Our Condition Without Christ (vv. 1-3)

- 1. "As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins"
- 2. What is spiritual death? Simply put, it is separation from God because of sin.
- 3. Paul describes it as "being alienated from the life of God" in Ephesians 4:18.
- 4. It can also be referred to as walking in darkness. (v2)
- 5. If we live apart from Christ, we are all open to any type leading.
- 6. We are easily influenced by the world, the flesh, and the devil.
- 7. If we don't stand for God we fall for anything!
- 8. We live according to our sinful nature, seeking fulfillment in worldly things.
- 9. We live as "Children of wrath" the natural consequence of sin is judgment.
- C. The Past of Every Christian Is Usually Not Very Pretty (vv. 1-3)
 - 1. We were all dead in trespasses and sins.
 - 2. We all walked according to the course of this sinful world. (1 John 2:16.)
 - 3. We were living to get; to gaze & to gloat (the pride of life)
 - 4. Our minds were captivated by lust & greed, deserving God's wrath (John 3:36)

D. The Richness of God's Mercy and Love - The Present of Every Christian

- 1. <u>But...God</u> (v. 4): The turning point in the passage, where God's grace intervenes.
- 2. Despite our hopeless condition, God acts out of mercy and love.
- 3. "Because of His great love for us... made us alive with Christ."
- 4. God's mercy isn't a response to our need, it flows from His great love for us,
- 5. God is rich in everything to do with salvation, which God's initiative, not ours.
- 6. His love enters our lives and changes them.
- 7. We were dead, but He has made us alive, as a result of His grace.
- 8. Through Christ's resurrection, we are made alive & raised up with Him.
- 9. This is a new identity & position in Christ, made possible by His death for us.
- 10. God's ultimate purpose is to show the incomparable riches of His grace.
- 11. Grace is not just for our personal benefit, but to display God's glory.

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E. The Gift of Grace (vv. 8-9)

- 1. "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God."
- 2. Salvation is not something earned or deserved, it's not a reward for our efforts.
- 3. This verse dismantles any idea of self-righteousness.
- 4. Rely on Christ's finished work rather than their own efforts.

F. God's Work in You

- 1. You have not always been a Christian.
- 2. Even so, you have been the beneficiary of God's blessings. (Philippians 1:6)
 - a. The rain falls on the just and the unjust.
 - b. We are all surrounded by God's handiwork and wonders.
- 3. Believers have had a special work of God in them.
 - a. A work of God's Spirit that brought conviction of sin.
 - b. A work of God that enabled them to understand the gospel.
 - c. A work of God that brought them to faith in Christ.
- 4. Has there been a new beginning in your life?
- 5. The new birth is absolutely necessary to enter heaven (John 3:1-5).
- 6. God's work in you is a good work.
- 7. Some people are afraid to let God work in them.
- 8. But God works for our good, in Salvation, Discipleship, Personal revival
- 9. God's continuing work in us through three things:
- 10. The Bible (Heb. 4:12); His Spirit (John 14). Circumstances (Rom. 8:28).
- 12. He "will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ" & so He is not finished yet.
- 13. The goal of God's work is to make you more like Jesus (Rom. 8:28-29)
- 14. What does God need to do in you to accomplish His purpose?

G. The New Life We Have in Christ (v. 10)

- 1. We are God's masterpiece, living out our new identity in Christ.
- 2. "For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works."
- 3. Salvation is not the end of the journey but the beginning of a new purpose.
- 4. We were created for good works that God has prepared for us to do.
- 5. Being saved by grace leads to a transformed life.
- 6. To walk in good works, not to earn salvation, but as a response to God's grace.

H. The Future of Every Christian (v. 7)

- 1. The great thing for us, the best is yet to come. Keep hold of your fork!
- 2. The grace of God was not used up in salvation. This was just the beginning.
- 3. Remember where you came from. Also, remember where you are going!
- 4. Recognize God's work in you, and respond to His call every day..
- 5. Don't have a great day. Make it a great day!
