Come, Lord Jesus

Revelation 22:12-21

A. The Revelation Of Jesus

- 1. We have seen Scripture is full of invitations.
- 2. As said, one of God's favourite words is "Come"
- 3. Today, we come to the final invitation.
- 4. A person's final words are said to carry more weight than any others they utter.
- 5. It is significant that the last written words are an invitation, a prayer & a promise.
- 6. The last promise is "I come quickly"
- 7. The last invitation is "Amen. Even so, come, Lord Jesus"
- 8. The last invitation is a prayer by John for Jesus to return
- 9. H. A. Ironside: "Surely every believing heart can join in the apostle's prayer"
- 10. The final words of the Bible emphasize the promise of the return of Jesus.
- 11. It also lays out our response to this promise of His coming.
- 12. It presents a call to readiness, an invitation to salvation, & a promise of blessing.
- 13. "Come, Lord Jesus" expresses the longing of the Church for Christ's return.

B. Why Did John Invite Jesus to Return?

- 1. John had seen the results of the world's rebellion.
- 2. John had seen man at his worst.
 - a. He had been there when Jesus was rejected and betrayed.
 - b. He had stood at the cross when Christ was crucified.
 - c. He had known many of the martyrs and had been exiled for his faith.
- 3. Jesus had given John a panorama of prophecy, a view of the future.
- 4. John knew the certainty of Christ's return (v. 12-13)
 - a. He had witnessed a preview of the wrath of the Lamb (Rev. 6).
 - b. He had been given a glimpse of the coming Great Tribulation.
- 5. John had inside information on things others only speculate about.
 - a. He had seen the rise of the beast and the false prophet (Rev. 13).
 - b. He had seen previews of the Battle of Armageddon (Rev. 14).
- 6. Having seen all of this violence, he longed for the return of the Prince of Peace.

C. John Had Seen the Glory of Christ's Return

- 1. He had a vision of believers in heaven filled with praise in Rev 4:1
- 2. He had heard the songs of the saints from every tribe and nation.
- 3. John witnessed the marriage of the Lamb & His bride, the Church (Rev. 19).
 - a. He had seen the Bridegroom on horseback returning to reign.
 - b. He marvelled at the majesty of KING OF KINGS & LORD OF LORDS.
- 4. John had seen the new Jerusalem coming down of heaven (Rev. 21).
- 5. John had firsthand information of the rewards of Christ for His people (v12)
- 6. The blessing of those who are ready those who wash their robes.

- 7. John was ready for the vision to become reality & to take place.
- 8. John longed for that coming great day. "Behold, I am coming soon!"
- 9. He comes with rewards according to our deeds.
- 10. Jesus declares His eternal nature: "I am the Alpha and the Omega."
- 11. Do we live in readiness and faithfulness, knowing that Christ will return?
- 12. Is your life surrendered to Christ so that you may receive His eternal reward?

D. John Wanted to See His Returning King

- 1. John had been exiled on that island of Patmos long enough.
- 2. John wanted to see Jesus to reminisce about their days on earth together.
- 3. John wanted the new body that will never grow old.
- 4. John wanted to hold those nail-scarred hands & meet his Saviour face to face.
- 5. Jesus identifies as "the Root and Offspring of David", "the Bright Morning Star."
- 6. This shows His authority, eternal nature, & role as the bringer of hope & light.
- 7. Just as the morning star (Venus) heralds the dawn of a new day, Jesus signifies the promise of a new beginning and eternal life for believers.
- 8. These descriptions underscore His dual identity as both divine and human, bridging the gap between God and humanity.
- 9. He had been given the open invitation to all who thirst for salvation. (v17)
- 10. God's grace is freely offered to those who will receive it.
- 11. If you have not accepted Christ, now is the time to respond to His call.

E. Jesus Warns Against Adding or Taking Away From Scripture (v.18-19)

- 1. We need to be careful with misquoting passages, or taking out of context.
- 2. Do we think the way we read a passage is the only way it could be understood.
- 3. Is it the way the initial listeners understood it? Or has our understanding been coloured by our cultural, generational & historical worldview grid?
- 4. The whole of Scripture needs to guide us in our daily walk.
- 5. The integrity of Scripture is divinely protected.
- 6. Do we treat it with that level of respect? The level it deserves?
- 7. Those who reject God's Word risk losing their share in the tree of life. (v18-19)
- 8. We need to hold firm to the truth of God's Word and live by it.
- 9. This reaffirms Jesus' comments earlier in this chapter. (Rev 22:7-9)

F. The Final Prayer and Promise (v. 20-21)

- 1. Jesus affirms: "Surely, I am coming soon." John responds: "Come, Lord Jesus!"
- 2. The book ends with a final blessing: "The grace of the Lord Jesus be with all."
- 3. Can you pray John's prayer with confidence?
- 4. Are you like John, longing for Christ's return while resting in His grace.
- 5. Jesus' return is imminent; are we ready for Him to come?
- 6. He offers eternal life—will we respond to His invitation?
- 7. As believers, we anticipate His coming with joy and expectation.
- 8. Invite Him into your life, then you can invite Him to return.
