Day of Good News

2 Kings 7:1-11; 16-17

A. The Siege of Samaria

- 1. Over time there have been more days of war than of peace.
- 2. In the past few centuries there has been a war somewhere in the world.
- 3. This passage shows God's power to deliver & the importance of faith.
- 4. It demonstrates His ability to turn hopeless situations into miraculous victories.
- 5. Context of the passage is Samaria under siege by Ben-Hadad, king of Aram.
- 6. This led to a devastating famine (2 Kings 6:24-33), causing a hopeless situation.
- 7. The famine was so severe that people resorted to unthinkable acts to survive.
- 8. People were killing & eating their children to survive.
- 9. The king had no answers, and hope seemed lost.
- 10. The king blamed God (2 Kings 6:33) & wanted to kill Elisha (2 Kings 6:31).

B. Elisha's Surprising Prophecy (v. 1)

- 1. Amid this famine, Elisha proclaimed a promise of deliverance (2 Kings 7:1-2)
- 2. Elisha declared the word of the Lord: "Tomorrow... food will be plentiful."
- 3. The officer escorting the king doubted the truth of Elisha's words. (2 Kings 7:2)
- 4. The passage teaches us the danger of unbelief in God's promises.
- 5. No situation is too desperate for God.
- 6. Human reasoning often cannot grasp God's supernatural provision.
- 7. Unbelief shuts the door to God's blessing.
- 8. Trust in God's Word, even when circumstances seem impossible.
- 9. Faith requires believing in God's promises, even when they defy logic.
- 10. Doubt can blind us to God's power and lead to missed blessings.

C. Missionary Lessons from Four Lepers

- 1. The 4 lepers, outcasts from the city & society, became unexpected messengers.
- 2. They lived on generosity of passer-byes. No handouts for them in this situation.
- 3. One leper wisely analysed the situation
- 4. A question of survival: Why should we sit here and die? (v. 3)
- 5. Similar to God's cry to sinners: (Ezek. 18:31)
- 6. They needed to do nothing else to die but wait.
 - a. The same as it is with every sinner (John 3:18, 36)
 - b. We don't need to commit any more sin to go to hell, indecision is a state of death.
- 7. Apart from God's intervention, death awaited them if they moved or stayed.
- 8. Lost people face death if they stay in unbelief.
- 9. Their responses to the crisis are lessons for us all. "Why stay here until we die?"
- 9. The lepers decide to take some action, but faced risk, but possible life.
- 10. We all need to surrender to Christ
 - a. The risk: our eternal destination.
 - b. The hope: eternal life.
 - c. The promise of surrender to Him will save your life.

D. The Overwhelming Provision

- 1. God works in unexpected ways to bring deliverance.
- 2. God can use even the most unlikely people or circumstances to fulfill His plans.
- 3. God often uses unlikely people to bring His message of hope.
- 4. Faith involves moving forward, even when options seem limited.
- 5. The leper's step of faith led them to discover the enemy's camp was abandoned.
- 6. They were surprised to see the enemy had been defeated.
- 7. The lepers found life food & riches silver, & gold.
- 8. They first ate their fill, took treasure but then realized:
- 9. "This is a day of good news; we cannot keep it to ourselves."
- 10. They probably questioned why they should tell anyone.
- 11. When we experience God's grace, we are called to share it with others.
- 12. The lepers returned to the city to share the good tidings.
- 13. God can turn lack into abundance in an instant.
- 14. Eventually everyone in the city rushed out to plunder the camp.
- 15. Due to the abundance, God turned famine into feasting overnight.
- 16. The officer saw the miracle but didn't share in it, fulfilling Elisha's prophecy.
- 17. Faith opens the door to experience His promises; unbelief misses out.
- 18. Blessings are meant to be shared, not hoarded.
- 19. Share the good news of God's provision and salvation with others.
- 20. We see the fulfillment of God's Word (2 Kings 7:16-20)
- 21. God's Word never fails; His promises are always fulfilled.
- 22. Trust in God's timing and faithfulness, even when it seems delayed.

E. This Is also a Day of Good Tidings

- 1. Salvation has been provided & eternal life is offered to all to trust in Jesus
- 2. Humanity, like Samaria, faces hopelessness without God.
- 3. Jesus Christ has won the victory and provided life abundant.
- 4. We, like the lepers, must not keep the good news to ourselves.
- 5. Sharing the gospel brings others from death to life.
- 6. God uses ordinary people to carry extraordinary news.
- 7. We are called to trust His promises and share His abundance with the world.
- 8. "This is a day of good news and we are keeping it to ourselves..." (2 Kings 7:9).
- 9. God is faithful to His promises, and His power is unmatched.
- 10. Trust Him in every situation, and share His blessings with others.
- 11. Commit to sharing His goodness with those around you.
