2 Peter 1

A. The Christian Life Has a Great Beginning

- 1. Faith in Christ makes us partaker of the divine nature
- 2. The Holy Spirit enters our live at the new birth (John 3:5-8)
- 3. Even so, some believers live barren i.e., not fulfilling their potential (2 Peter 1:8)
- 4. The tools for triumphant living come from God (1:5-8
- 5. 2 Peter is a book of wisdom, & warnings, also promises, & precautions.
- 6. We'll pursue three precious possessions today; Faith; peace; & promises.

B. Why Is Faith Precious?

- 1. The Christian life begins with faith (Acts 16:31)
- 2. Apart from faith there is no other way of salvation (Rom. 5:1)
- 3. We cannot work our way to heaven (Eph. 2:8-9)
- 4. Faith links us to Christ, starting an ever-widening flow of power.
- 5. Virtue and knowledge flow from faith (see (2 Tim. 2:15); (Ps. 119:9-11)
- 6. The normal Christian longs to be like Jesus; asking ourselves WWJD?
- 7. Faith in Christ brings justification to sinners (Rom. 5:1-10)
- 8. We are all sinners, & the law cannot justify us; only faith. (Rom. 3:10-26)
- 9. Faith brings forgiveness and eternal life (Rom. 10:9-13)
- 10. No wonder Peter calls faith precious!

C. Why Is Peace Precious?

- 1. Lost people are on a constant quest for peace
- 2. We are by nature troubled people in a troubled world
- 3. Most try finding peace but discover counterfeits, preventing peace (Isa. 57:21)
- 4. We find peace through faith in Christ. Prince of Peace (Isa. 9:6), (Ps. 4:8)
- 5. Focusing our thoughts on Christ brings perfect peace (Isa. 26:3)
- 6. Full surrender to Christ brings peace beyond all understanding (Phil. 4:7)

D. Why Are the Promises of God Precious? (v. 4)

- 1. They are precious because of the Giver, & because they are true
- 2. These precious promises expose the corruption of the world
- 3. These precious promises are eternal (2 Cor. 1:20)
- 4. Peter's purpose in life was to commit himself to their development.
- 5. He promises to keep repeating what they need to know to grow.
- 6. He will be faithful to those who have come to faith
- 7. He will keep instructing them in Christian growth with a lifetime guarantee.
- 8. He will keep reminding them of God's love, & the truths of the gospel
- 9. We need to follow Peter's example in building up believers
- 10. Do converts in our church know we care about their needs?

E. Self-Control and Patience Flow from Knowledge (v. 6)

- 1. The more we know about Jesus the more we become like Him.
- 2. Jesus personified self-control. His enemies couldn't find fault in Him.
- 3. Satan tried to get Him to yield to temptation but could not do so.
- 4. The closer we walk with Jesus the more we experience self-control

F. Godliness, Kindness, and Love Flow from Patience (vv. 6-7)

- 1. Patience or perseverance in difficult times makes us godly people
- 2. Consider the difficulties Jesus endured on His way to the cross
- 3. Remember His patience when He stood before Herod and Pilate
- 4. Remembering the kindness of Christ makes us kind to others (Acts 2-5)
- 5. People should know we are Christians by our love (Gal. 5:22-23)

G. Peter Affirms His Message Is Built on Facts

- 1. He declares the gospel was on a firm foundation, not cunningly devised fables.
- 2. The Transfiguration vindicated the mission of Christ (Matt. 17:1-6)
- 3. The voice from heaven silenced the voices of critics on earth.
- 4. How can we get in on mountaintop experiences?
- 5. We must follow Jesus (Matt. 17:1; 2 Peter 1:16)
- 6. Sometimes following means separating from others, to surrender to Him.
- 7. Are you willing to follow Jesus all the way?
- 8. We must keep our eyes open (Matt. 17:2; 2 Peter 1:16).
- 9. Peter became an eyewitness of the majesty of Christ.
- 10. He would never forget this miraculous moment.
- 11. He claimed this experience as proof of his authority to minister.
- 12. Peter remembered what he saw. Christ was transfigured before him.
- 13. This mountaintop experience was unforgettable to Peter.
- 14. We must seek God's will or we'll miss His plan for our lives.
- 15. We Must Listen to the Lord (Luke 9:31; 2 Peter 1:17-18)
- 16. What did Jesus, Moses, and Elijah talk about on that mountain? (Luke 9:31)
- 17. Focusing on the cross brings us to mountaintop experiences.
- 18. What did the Father say on the Mount of Transfiguration?
- 19. "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased"
- 20. We must be sensitive to what God says to us about His Son.
- 21. Have you claimed God's precious promise of salvation?

H. What Mountaintop Experiences Do You Remember?

- 1. Are you trusting God's precious promises today?
- 2. The committed Christian is delivered from barren living (v. 8)
- 3. Fruit flows from the life that Is surrendered to Christ. How fruitful are you?
- 4. What are we doing to fulfill His Great Commission (Matt. 28:18-20)?
