Nevertheless, Remember God's Promises

2 Peter 3:10-18

A. Let's Summarize Peter's Final Book

- 1. God not only judges the ungodly but also delivers His people.
- 2. He promises a new creation. It is a book of promises (1:1-4)
- 3. It is a book of protection (2:5-9) We see Noah & Lot rescued amid corruption.
- 4. It is a book of prophecy (3:1-13), promising a new heaven and new earth.
- 5. God always tempers darkness with light.
- 6. Jesus brought light to this dark world.
- 7. He brings good news to troubled people.
- 8. Peter calls us to live godly lives, to grow in grace until Christ returns.
- 9. The previous verses present a dark picture.
- 10. God's Word assures judgment despite scoffers.
- 11. God's patience is salvation, but judgment is sure.
- 12. The certainty of Christ's return calls us to holiness, hope, & growth in Christ.
- 13. We are to pursue holy living with our conduct shaped by the coming renewal.
- 14. We can look forward with hope, anticipating the new heavens & new earth.
- 15. We are called to grow in grace & knowledge, to mature, & avoid deception.
- 16. Holiness is preparation for eternity.
- 17. Hope sustains us in trials.
- 18. Growth in Christ is the best defence against false teaching.
- 19. Now God's great "Nevertheless" option is announced.
- 20. Blessings await those who take the long look.
- 21. Remember, the best is yet to come!

B. Joy Will Follow Judgment

- 1. The day of the Lord is on its way.
- 2. The world will not expect it, as it will come as a thief in the night.
- 3. Peter has instructed us about things to come.
- 4. Peter urges us to live in the light of Christ's return.
- 5. This thought flows through Peter's last call.
- 6. Here is a call for consistency in Christian living, for constant growth in us all.
- 7. Cataclysmic events will occur, as the earth and its works will be burned up.
- 8. The heavens will pass away loudly & the elements will melt with fervent heat.
- 9. Nevertheless, better days await those who belong to the Lord.
- 10. The promises of God outweigh the trials of earth, & the future is as bright.
- 11. The expectation of Christ's return promotes holy living.
- 12. If Christ had returned this morning, would you have been ashamed?
- 13. Peter calls for us to be at peace with God: without spot and blameless.
- 14. He calls us to advance in grace and the knowledge of Christ.
- 15. Peter has sounded this call before. (1 Peter 2:21)
- 16. Do others see our walk with Christ deepening or weakening?

C. We Must Be Aware of God's Love for Sinners (v. 15)

- 1. Peter reminds us to: "Bear in mind that our Lord's patience means salvation"
- 2. God does not want people to perish, (see John 3:16; & 1John 3:16)
- 2. Do we have the same love for those who don't know Jesus as He does?
- 3. How does our concern for sinners compare to such love?
- 4. How much time & money are we investing in missions & witnessing?
- 5. Focus on God's love for sinners to bring revival to our church & the world.

D. The World As We Know It Will Cease To Exist.

- 1. The love of earthly possessions has deceived man & led many astray.
- 2. Beware the danger & deception. (Gen. 13; Luke 18:18-25; Luke 12:16-21)
- 3. The temporary nature of things asks what their value will be when Christ returns?
- 4. The current possessions will be dissolved, where wealth will be worthless.
- 5. Nevertheless, the promises of peace and plenty persist. (Rev 21)
- 6. God will keep His word given to His own, because God will not be surprised.
- 7. It is folly to invest here on Earth, as all tied to time is temporary (2 Cor. 4:18)
- 8. Near the end of life, Peter had no regrets, having proven the promises of Christ.
- 9. Peter made a clear call to invest in things above that stand the test of time.
- 10. Peter calls us to consider all in the light of his prophecy *How shall we then live?*
- 11. How has the prospect of what's ahead affected your life? (Matt. 6:19-20)
- 12. What shall we do with our possessions in light of Christ's return?
- 13. Has your life been cantered on temporary trinkets? (Matt. 6:20)
- 14. Are you ready for Christ-cantered living with eternity's values in view?

E. We Are All Sinners, Nevertheless God Loves Us

- 1. We deserve hell, nevertheless Christ promises heaven to those who trust Him.
- 2. Trials are real & inevitable, nevertheless, God's Grace is sufficient.
- 3. Since everything will be dissolved, live in holiness and godliness.
- 4. Be diligent to be found by Christ "without spot or blemish."
- 5. Our lifestyle should reflect our hope, living holy and expectant lives.
- 6. Don't cling to temporary things—invest in eternal ones.
- 7. Our righteous Lord will reign in the new heaven and earth.
- 8. Are you looking forward to that day?
- 9. When trials come remember the "nevertheless" option.
- 10. Peter's last call is the Lord's call to us today.
- 11. How will we respond to His call?
