Remember God's Judgement

2Peter 3:1-11

A. A Book About the Future

- 1. Each chapter in 2 Peter is prophetic
- 2. It is an epistle to alert its readers to prepare for the return of Christ
- 3. We need to frequently revisit the moment of our new birth
- 4. Foundational truths strengthen commitment
- 5. The basics of the gospel, Christ came for their salvation.
- 6. Because Christ promised to return, we can live with hope, holiness, & urgency.
- 7. Peter urges readers to stay grounded in the Bible, discern truth & remain faithful.
- 8. To remember God's Word is reliable; it shapes our perspective on the future.
- 9. In an age of doubt, cling to Scripture as your foundation.

C. Peter Warns Of The Scoffers To Come

- 1. Peter reminds us the words of the prophets are not fables.
- 2. Peter also warned them of scoffers to come questioning Christ's return.
- 3. Been many promises of His coming Eg: Matt 24; 25; John 14 & 1 Thess. 4.
- 4. The flood proves God judges; the present world is reserved for fire & judgment.
- 5. Consider scoffers of the past who were proved wrong.
- 6. The scoffers of Noah's time, of Sodom and Gomorrah; Belshazzar (Dan. 5)
- 7. To believers, the return of Christ is a purifying hope (1 John 3:3)
- 8. Scoffers try to avoid the question in spite of biblical assurances.
- 9. The long wait for Christ's coming is no reason to doubt that He will come.
- 10. But truth must ultimately be faced: Christ will return! Why scoff?

D. Some Prefer Sin to Salvation (v. 3)

- 1. Some enjoy their old sinful ways, so they reject the gospel.
- 2. They scoffed at the need for purity, thinking that morality doesn't matter.
- 3. They scoff at the prophecies of His return and live for what feels good
- 4. Their poor present judgment will bring them certain future judgment.
- 5. The long wait seems proof to them that He will not keep His promise
- 6. Why wait so long? Why hasn't Christ come to fulfill His promise?
- 7. Why has Christ not come to still the voices of the scoffers?
- 8. Peter gives some answers to those who wonder why we wait

E. The Lord Demonstrates His Patience

- 1. Peter has revealed some are willingly ignorant about Christ's return.
- 2. Jesus said no one would know the day nor the hour of His return (Matt. 24:36)
- 3. We are always to be ready, expecting His return at any moment (Matt. 24:42)
- 4. How do we know that Christ will come right on time?
- 5. The Lord doesn't break promises. When the Lord says it, we can believe it.
- 6. There are many, many Old Testament promises of His coming. (Eg Isa)
- 7. Prophets spoke, then, right on time, Christ was born (Gal. 4:3-5)

- 8. The patience of God is demonstrated in His creation, & in mankind.
- 9. The Lord delights in the saving of one soul (v. 9).
- 10. God is not willing that any should perish.
- 11. The Lord is long-suffering; His patience has not been exhausted.
- 12. The patience of God is one of the reasons for His seeming delay
- 13. The psalmist recognized God's patience and gave thanks for it (Ps. 103:8-10)
- 14. Why, then, are we so impatient regarding the fulfillment of His promise?
- 15. We ought to wait for Christ's coming with confidence & expectation (1Jn 2:28)
- 16. These days of waiting should be days of evangelism.
- 17. God has granted us this moment to trust and serve him.
- 18. Christ will arrive right on time! Will we be ready?
- 19. What are you doing to reach one more soul before Christ returns?

F. The Lord's Promise Will Be Fulfilled

- 1. Speculating about when Christ's return is fruitless. No-one knows in advance.
- 2. Each passing moment moves us closer to the fulfillment of the promise.
- 3. God's time is reckoned by His clock, not ours.
- 4. He has judged before, see the fallen angels, the flood, Sodom & Gomorrah.
- 5. God's judgment may seem delayed, but it is certain. He will judge again.
- 6. Don't mistake God's patience for weakness, it's an opportunity for repentance.
- 7. His patience means salvation, but His judgment will come suddenly.
- 8. Live in readiness, because judgment will be swift and certain.
- 9. Use the time God gives to grow in faith and share the Gospel.

G. The Lord's Passion Determines the Arrival of That Great Day

- 1. God is "not willing that any should perish"
- 2. The heavens and earth will pass away, with cleansing fire (v. 10).
- 3. Everything will be laid bare. New heavens & new earth.
- 4. Every day until the Rapture is a call to repentance
- 5. Turn while there is time, come to Christ before He comes
- 6. Don't harden your heart and miss this opportunity (Heb. 4:7)

H. Conclusion

- 1. The world laughs at the idea of Christ's return, but God's Word is sure.
- 2. His delay is not neglect but mercy, His patience mercy, not weakness.
- 3. The call is to holiness, readiness, and growth. Are you ready?
- 4. Ignorance of Christ's imminent return ls no excuse.
- 5. God's perspective on time is different, His "delay" gives space for repentance.
- 6. The Day of the Lord will come suddenly and bring cosmic renewal.
- 7. Use God's patience as an opportunity to share the gospel.
- 8. Live every day as though Christ could return today. Prepare today!
- 9. Has the certainty of Christ's return shaped your priorities, actions, & relationships?
- 10. Hold fast to God's promises, know His Word is true & His timing is perfect.
- 11. Live with urgency—Christ could return at any moment.
